Tuberculosis Epidemiologic Studies Consortium (TBESC): Study Site Study 1 Prospective comparison of the tuberculin skin test versus the interferon gamma release assays in diagnosing latent tuberculosis infection and in predicting progression to active TB disease.

Description of research: As a newly selected site in the ten site consortium of academic centers and public health departments that make up the TBESC, the first year is in developing the infrastructure necessary to efficiently and effectively conduct the research. The activities of the consortium will be comprised of the main study and several sub-studies. The main objective of the study is to evaluate and compare the performance of the TST and IGRAs in diagnosing LTBI and in predicting progression to active disease. It is a multi-center, prospective, longitudinal cohort with eight years of enrolment and ten years of follow-up. The several sub-studies which will be conducted concurrently will evaluate shorter LTBI treatment regimens and evaluate measures to improve adherence to LTBI therapy.

Using Social Network Analysis to Enhance Tuberculosis Contact Investigations

Description of Research: Design and construct a portable web-enabled tuberculosis contact investigation tool and field test the device. The purpose of the tool is to assist the contact investigator achieve a more efficient investigation of the source case's contacts. The tool will incorporate social network analysis to enhance the identification of potential sites of TB transmission.
